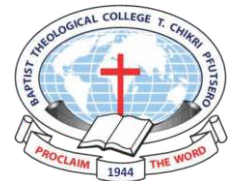

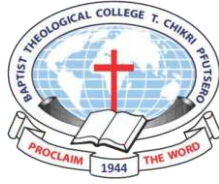

## BRIEF HISTORY OF BAPTIST THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE

Baptist Theological College, as it stands today, has undergone several changes in nomenclature, location, and in the nature of the programs, primarily because of World War II, Naga political movement, and also because of the needs arising out of time. In some years, it had fallen into a coma, only to come back alive with greater vigor.

The College was first established on February 15, 1944 through the initiative of local Christians. It was located at Chayaba (between Chozuba and Yorüba), on a site where Tanquist once bought a plot of land for a school project. The Bible School was known as *Bible School*. It was under Kohima Elakha (field) and Chakhesangs were known as "Eastern Angamis" then. The main objective was to train Christian leaders to take care of newly planted local churches and to evangelize to the non-Christians. The medium of instruction was in Tenyidie. It closed down on March 18, 1944 due to the World War II. It recommenced in 1945. Mr Edisoí Rosé was one of the main teachers and the Headmaster all along.

After the Chakhesangs were recognized as a separate tribe in 1946, with Phezou (Phek now) as its centre, the tribe leaders resolved to shift the Bible School to Phezou in 1948. On September 21, 1949, the Phek villagers donated a plot of land to establish the Chakhesang Baptist Church Association (now CBCC). In 1950, on April 15, the Bible School became functional in conjunction with the inauguration of the Chakhesang Baptist Church. The Bible School was named *Phezou Bible School* with the motto, "Labour, Love, Service". But records show that it was also known by other names such as *Bible School Phezou*, *Chakhesang Bible School Phezou* and also *Christian Bible School Phezou*. But obviously it referred to the same School. The medium of instruction was still in Tenyidie. Rev. Megousieso Savino was the Headmaster of the Bible School besides being the Field Director of CBCA. He was succeeded by Pelesato Chasè in 1953 and served as both Headmaster of the School and Field Director until his assassination by the India army in 1956.

The Indo-Naga political conflict forced the School to close down between 1956 and 1957. From January to July 14, 1958 the Bible School was temporarily shifted to Chizami under State protection. On July 15, 1958, the School was shifted back to Phezou. In 1960, the 14<sup>th</sup> Assam Rifles occupied the Mission Centre in Phezou. Thus, on March 1, 1961, both the Mission Centre and the Bible School was permanently shifted to Pfütsero. On the appeal of the CBCC, the Tüyinumí clan of Kikruma graciously donated the present site for the ministry of the Lord. (As a mark of appreciation, the "T. Chikri" is used as part of the official address of the Mission centre till today).

With the shifting to Pfütsero, the School came to be known as *Chakhesang Bible School (CBS)* with the motto "Let there be Light." Records also show its names as *T. Chekri Bible School* and *Chakhesang Christian Baptist Bible School*. The medium of instruction remained in Tenyidie. In 1975, on 5<sup>th</sup> December, the CBCC decided to upgrade its program and introduce English as a medium of instruction. Thereby, the name of the School was changed to *Chakhesang Bible Institute (CBI)* with the objective of preparing Christian leaders of various communities in Northeast India for the spread of the Gospel. The English medium three years diploma program, was introduced in 1976. The Institute was recognized by CBCNEI in May, 1980.

Later in September 1988, the CBCC resolved to upgrade the CBI to a College level and to offer degrees with Senate of Serampore College/University (SSC/U). Consequently, the name was changed to *Baptist Theological College* and the Bachelor of Theology (BTh) degree program was officially inaugurated on July 15, 1989. The process for affiliation to SSC/U started immediately and BTC was provisionally recognized in 1992. Again, on July 15, 2006 the B. Th program was officially upgraded to Bachelor of Divinity (BD) degree course. It continues to offer the same course.

On December 13, 2019, the Baptist Institute for Church Music (BICuM) was inaugurated and now offers a one year Certificate in Church Music (CCM) program and other music-related trainings. The Master of Theology (MTh) in Christian Theology was officially inaugurated on June 05, 2022 by Rev Dr Prof., Wati Aier but had to be closed down on July 29, 2022.

The grace of God has been leading BTC and He will continue to guide BTC's future.



## AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The Baptist Theological College has been established to;

1. Provide sound biblical-theological education;
2. Equip men and women for the holistic ministry;
3. Promote ecumenical-theological education and a wider participation in the mission of God;
4. Nurture men and women in spiritual formation and ministerial excellence;

### STATEMENT OF FAITH

Being saved and commissioned to protect and to propagate Christian faith, the College is committed to the following confessions:

1. We believe in one God, eternally existing in three persons: The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

## COLLEGE MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION

The College is an institution of Chakhesang Baptist Church Council. It has the following levels of authorities for functioning.

**CBCC Executive Committee:** This is the final body for approving the decisions of the BTC Board of Governors (BoG).

**Board of Governors:** The BoG is the recommending body of the College in relation to appointment of administrative officers, members of the teaching faculty and staff and for general management policies of the College.

**Board of Trustees:** The BoT is responsible for managing and making decisions concerning BTC's properties and assets.

### Administrative Officers:

1. **The Principal:** The Principal is the chief administrative head of the College, responsible to the Board of Governors for all the affairs of the College, including finance and development.
2. **The Vice Principal:** The Vice Principal is the second administrative head of the College, responsible for all matters pertaining to academic affairs of the College.

**College Faculty:** The College faculty is comprised of full time teaching staff. It is the executive body within the College. It has the jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to academic program, discipline of the students and curricular and extra-curricular activities.

## FIELD EDUCATION

With an aim to give a live-in experience of the community and the life of the church, and as per the requirement of the Senate of Serampore College/ University, students are assigned to carry out practical ministry for 21 days.

Also, the students are assigned to a particular church or institution every year for weekly ministry during College session.

## COLLEGE DIPLOMA

The College awards its own Diploma. The College Diploma will be awarded to only those students who fulfill the following criteria:

- Have satisfactorily completed the College examined papers securing at least C- (40%)
- Maintain good moral conduct in life.
- Participate in the College community worship services and practical works arranged by the College.
- Maintain good relationship with people within and outside the College.



## GENERAL AND ACADEMIC AWARDS

*The College institute awards to encourage graduating students, acknowledging their service, skills and potentialities, and to honor the memory of faith-related pioneers of the community.*



**Rev. Zupelhi and Eso-ü Mero Award** for *Academic Proficiency* is instituted by the family of the couple in honor of their services to BTC in its initial years. It is awarded to a graduating student who has the highest overall grade in the entire period of study.



**Kewetshüpe Mero Award** for *General Contribution* is instituted by his sisters in memory of his service to CBCC as a Youth Secretary. It is awarded to a graduating student who has made noteworthy contribution to the college in all aspects.



**Netsütso Theyo Award** for *Ministry* is instituted by his children in honor of his memory as the first convert to Christianity from Theyyizu village, and also the first pastor of the village church. Although he later joined the state politics to become a deputy minister (1966) and cabinet minister (1971) in the Nagaland Legislative Assembly, he continued to be an ardent minister for the Lord. It is awarded to a graduating student who has shown greatest enthusiasm for ministry and shows potential for excellence even in the future.



**Medikhrü Award** for *Mission* is instituted by the family of one of his sons. Medikhrü of Leshemi was a pioneering founder of Chakhesang Baptist Church Kohima and was keenly engaged in doing missions with Burma Nagas. It is awarded to a graduating student who has actively engaged in missions and evangelistic work and has continuing commitment to the same task.



**Etshirü (Sarè) Award** for *Practical Work and Field Education* is instituted by Chizami Baptist Church in honor of his memory as the first convert to Christianity from Chizami and the first Pastor of the Village church. He was also a pioneering evangelist to the Chakhesangs and Burma Nagas in the early years of Christianity. It is awarded to a graduating student who has secured the highest mark in the area of practical work and field education in the entire course of studies.



**Vamuzo Award** for *Church Music* is instituted by the family of Mr. Vamuzo, the former Chief Minister of Nagaland, in honor of his memory as a passionate lover of music with an innate musicality for the indigenous Li. He is also noted for translating 56 church hymns into Chokri Naga dialect with staff notation, which stands as the first of its kind among the Nagas. It is awarded to a graduating student who has made the most noteworthy contribution to the music ministry of the College in the entire course of study and has potential for excellence in church music ministry even in the future.

**Baptist Award for Lifetime Service (BAFoLS):** This Award is instituted by the College to recognize a Chakhesang or others (in special cases) for their notable service to the local and global community of faith. It is awarded once in three years on the occasion of College's Foundation Day Anniversary.



**Proficiency Awards in Different Clusters of Studies:** Proficiency Award is awarded to graduating students who have secured highest mark in Biblical Cluster, Theology and Ethics Cluster, History and Mission Cluster, Christian Ministry Cluster, Interdisciplinary Cluster, General Studies, Preaching, Religion Cluster and Scripture.

**Annual College Awards :** Annual College Awards is organized by the college authority to recognize the toppers and runners-up in all subject clusters of each class in an academic year.

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## ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

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### BD Candidates

The test is conducted in the following areas:

- **Scripture Knowledge:** This is to see the candidate's scriptural foundations. Any question may be asked from the Bible.
- **English Language:** The medium of instruction is English language. Thus, the efficiency of the candidate in English language usage is examined.
- **General Knowledge:** This is to examine the candidate's awareness of current events and issues in the world.
- **Oral Interview:** To examine the candidate's overall calling to the Lord's ministry and capability for successfully undergoing theological training.

Eligibility:

1. Must have passed 10+2 for 5 years Integrated BD
2. Graduate and above for BD four years course.
3. BTh degree from SSC or those with BTH from ATA institute who have passed qualifying exam of the SSC will do BD for two years only.

### Certificate in Church Music (CCM)

1. There is no entrance exam for CCM candidates
  2. CCM candidates must clear class 10.
  3. Have recommendation from local church pastor.
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## BTCSA (BTCSA)

The Baptist Theological College Students Association (BTCSA) is the official students' body of the College, constituted by full time students. The College encourages student's body to use its various opportunities for the development of leadership qualities and to participate in contributing to the total life of the college through the different committees.

## LIFE AND ACTIVITIES

The College conducts various activities to equip students and help them build and maintain a disciplined spiritual, academic and good Christian life.

### SPIRITUAL LIFE

The College encourages the students to develop healthy spiritual life in accordance with the teaching of the Bible. To develop the spiritual life of individuals and the College community as a whole, several programmes are scheduled.

### PRACTICAL WORKS

There are two types of practical works: Ministerial training and Dignity of manual work.

1. Ministerial Training: Students are required to participate in the churches when work is assigned.
  - (i) Occasional Ministries: Students are sent out from time to time for evangelistic works to churches and other places on invitation.
  - (ii) Field Education: Practical tours are arranged by the Dean of Practical Work to visit Churches and Mission Fields for an intensive period as prescribed in the SSC curriculum.
  - (iii) Weekend Ministries: Students are sent to the local churches and institutions every weekend to do active ministries and also learn through observing and interacting.
2. Dignity of Manual Work: The College community and respective hostellers organize social works from time to time, cleaning campus and maintaining kitchen gardens in order to encourage students to stand on their own feet. It is mandatory for every student to bring their own working implement.

### COLLEGE UNIFORM

The color of the college uniform is black blazer. Every Monday and Thursday is set aside for wearing college uniform. However, students may choose to wear them on any other days as well.

## HOSTEL

The College, being a residential institute, has four hostels: two for women and two for men. Hostel life encourages personal and social development.

## GAMES & SPORTS

Every Friday is set apart for community Games and Sports. The College also conducts Annual Games & Sports Week once in an academic year.

## LITERARY

The Literary Committee organizes Literary Day once in a year where various competitions are conducted and monitors regular literary activities. The College also publishes its Annual Magazine to provide a platform for developing literary skills. The Committee also organizes the "drama club" to facilitate students for propagating messages through creative forms.

## BEAUTIFICATION

To maintain and promote a clean and conducive environment, the Beautification Committee looks after the cleanliness & beautification of the college.

## CULTURE

Every first Wednesday of the month is set aside for wearing a piece of cultural attires in order to promote and uphold the rich cultural heritage of all people groups. The Cultural Committee organizes Cultural Day once in an academic year. Students are expected to bring their own cultural attires.

## MUSIC

The College gives adequate importance to church music education. Regular music theory classes and practicals are part and parcel of BTC schedule. Choir membership is mandatory.

## BTC LECTURES

The College conducts BTC Lectures once in a month with an aim to motivate and equip students to engage critically and effectively with the issues confronting the Church and society. Research papers are presented by the faculty members or guest lecturers and it is open to students as well as all leaders in and around the town of Pfutsero.

## MENTORING PROGRAM

The College has mentorship program in which all the students are assigned to a faculty mentor for the entire period of study.

### **WORK SCHOLARSHIP**

The College provides work scholarship to students. Recipients are assigned certain responsibilities and tasks. The scholarship amount is credited to their fees.

### **RED-RIBBON CLUB (RRC)**

As part of the College's active engagement with community concerns, it partners with RRC to initiate relevant programs. Students can choose to be permanent members by paying nominal fee.

### **GRADUATION & COMMISSIONING**

On completing the residential period successfully, the College organizes a graduation and Commissioning service for the graduating class of the year to acknowledge their accomplishments, hand over diplomas, and to send them out into the world for active ministry in the presence of witnesses.

## **CENTRES OF BTC**

### **Baptist Institute of Church Music (BICuM)**

Recognizing the significance of Music in Church ministry, the College under BICuM offers Certificate in Church Music (CCM). It is a one year course. Introductory courses like music theory, worship and church music, voice, conducting and piano class are offered. The Center also organizes workshops, seminars, concerts, choir class and other activities.



### **Missions Training Centre (MTC)**

MTC offers short term training to pastors, missionaries, local mission board members, youth leaders, women pastors, and evangelists both from within and outside the state. The training courses are arranged according to the situation and needs of the people.

## SERVICES/FACILITIES AT BTC



### The Widow's Oil

Based on I Kings 17: 8-16, this ministry was conceived and established on 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2014, to help the students of the College. The ministry is looked after by the Missions Committee of the BTCSA. The College community and well-wishers donate good usable commodities and toiletries for anyone to use.

### Library

The library of the College houses around 30,000 volumes of books (both Hard & soft versions) and journals for enriching the academic pursuit of the students and other eligible users. It is digitalized and authorized users can access the library catalogue from the comforts of their location.



### Books Service

To help the students and the Church with theological books, BTC runs a Book Service. The books and merchandise are sold at discounted price.



**Media Room**

The College has a media room with basic facilities for the community to engage in digital modes of teaching and learning.



**Guest Room**

The guest room comes with two separate beds and attached bathroom with commode and geyser. Return generated from the facilities are used for the ministry of BTC.



**Archive/Museum**

The College, in partnership with the BTCSA, maintains an archive/museum for upholding traditional artifacts and remembering pioneers of the Institution.
